The Project is funded by the European Union and supported by the Asia Muslim Action Network, the International Network of Engaged Buddhists, United Network of Young Peacebuilders and the KAICIID Dialogue Centre.

Join #AHA! Small Grants and Capacity Building Programme

The AHA! Awareness with Human Action project seeks to contribute to the response efforts of the COVID-19 pandemic by preventing conflict and building social cohesion in Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and broader South Asia. The specific objective is to increase outreach for initiatives that promote awareness of COVID-19 and constructive narratives that reduce discrimination, hate speech, and stigmatization against specific communities, primarily targeting religious leaders, and women and youth leaders as community influencers. This work will focus on motivating critical community influencers, including religious leaders, youth and women leaders to spread factual messages and to promote human solidarity. To advance its objective, the AHA! project is providing small grants up to 5,000 EUR to individuals and up to 10,000 EUR to organisations from Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Pakistan. In addition, organisations are able to apply for up to 5,000 EUR small grants to support regional level initiatives. Small grant recipients will participate in a year-long virtual monthly capacity building and peer-learning process, and are able to apply for additional support to strengthen their digital capacity.
